LANDSCAPE

"Experiment Hill"

- 8 years of naturalization no mowing, seeding or fertilizing
- Small evergreen and underbrush have returned
- Soil erosion is minimal
- Natural habitat is beginning to thrive



Approximately 8 years ago the Board approved a proposed experiment to "naturalize" some common areas. This area located on the south west side of Stoney Creek was the first area the board

COMMUNITY MAINTENANCE-



Three years ago the Board approved expanding the naturalization efforts to the hillsides on the south side of Stoney Creek Drive.

The Experiment Continues

- Natural grasses have begun to slow erosion;
- Top soil is slowly being recreated naturally;
 - Small evergreen trees have taken root;
- Small patches of wildflowers were introduced two years ago to help slow erosion and beautify the hillsides with indigenous flowers

In the summer heat equipment is too hot for kids to use. The board is evaluating purchasing sail shades.




